BMF KENYA REPORT - APRIL 2023

1. SATURDAY 8th - UNDIRI NEIGHBOURHOOD OUTREACH

The meeting was held at my home (Samuel Njogu) from 7 pm to 10 pm.

This was the second neighbourhood outreach meeting.

We had about 80% of our immediate neighbours present! We managed to squeeze about 40

people into our living room.

Peter Njogu was the guest speaker and Herman Gichanga was the Master of Ceremonies.

About 10 people who were not believers accepted the call to believe in the Gospel, and I led the

prayer of faith. We also prayed for various needs in our families.

The neighbours were very grateful about this initiative and promised to support it by hosting

future outreaches and to invite others.

Two neighbourhood fellowships were scheduled in two homes from two adjacent neighbourhoods:

22nd April at Joseph Kamau's house and 13th May at John Thairu's home.

2. SUNDAYS 2nd, 23rd and 30th APRIL - ONDIRE YOUTH OUTREACH

The meetings were held on Sunday 2nd, 23rd and 30th April at the Presbyterian Church hall from

11 am to 12:30 pm. Various testimonies were shared including Bible study and open discussions.

37 youths attended with 21 accepting to commit their lives to Christ.

The next Undiri youth outreaches were scheduled for 7th, 14th, 21st and 28th May at the same venue.

3. 16th APRIL - MAIAIHII COMMUNITY OUTREACH

I was invited to speak to the Maiaihii Community from 10:30 am to 12:30 pm. A team comprising members of BMF and others in Kikuyu planned this meeting which was held in a

tent next to the Presbyterian Church in Maiaihii.

About 200 people attended this meeting. Initially, two meetings had been arranged but they

were consolidated into one.

I was the main speaker. The Lord's presence was evident in the meeting and at the end, almost

all that were not in Christ responded to the call of salvation. We estimated about 100 men and

women responded to Christ.

We met with the planning team and agreed to hold many other meetings in Maiaihii area.

Let us raise a Thanksgiving to the Lord for these outreaches. The support of the local community

and the Presbyterian church in advertising and providing equipment, like tents and chairs, as well

as leaders' participation is a great favour from the Lord.

Let us pray for many more meetings of this kind in other areas.

4. FRIDAY 21st - KANDARA MURANGA OUTREACH CONFERENCE

The meeting was held from 10:30 am up to 3:30 pm

78 men attended along with church pastors and leaders from the Kandara area.

James Mwaura (the host) was the Master of Ceremonies, and I was the main speaker, together

with Amos Waguchu.

My son, David, accompanied me to this meeting. and he spoke briefly on his experience in school.

Over 30 men responded to commit their lives to Jesus Christ.

The next Outreach Conference will be held on Friday 19th May.

5. 8th and 22nd - RIRUTA OUTREACH CONFERENCE

The 8th April Conference was held at the Pool of Healing Waters Church hall, with a total of 40

people in attendance. The second one was held in Amos Waguchu's home on 22nd with a total of 36 people.

A total of 28 men responded to receive Christ.

One man who responded to receive Christ was delivered from demons.

As I was speaking, he came forward to be prayed for and the Lord instructed me to rebuke the

spirit of death in him. He fell on the floor immediately and the spirit shook him briefly and then

left.

He woke up and testified of the Lord's doing, and we all rejoiced in singing to the Lord.

Amos Waguchu and his team reported that they had led 8 men to the Lord, in the month of April.

The next outreach conferences will be held on Saturday 13th and 27th May.

6. SATURDAY 22nd - UNDIRI NEIGHBOURHOOD OUTREACH

The meeting was held at Joseph Kamaus' home from 7:30 pm to 11:00 pm

We had 25 people in attendance.

Most of the attendants were believers.

We had a speaker, Mr. Waruhiu, who came along with two other men. They shared their testimonies.

3 men responded to the call of salvation.

We had a wonderful time of prayer and worship as we lifted the neighbourhood before the Lord.

I also guided the Chapter on how to effectively target the unbelievers to ensure that the neighbourhood outreaches do not become Christian meetings with no effect on reaching the

lost

among us.

The next Undiri neighbourhood outreach was scheduled for May 27th at Herman Gichanga's home

7. RIRUTA NEIGHBORHOOD FELLOWSHIPS EVERY THURSDAY 2 PM TO 4 PM

The Riruta Chapter has started their own neighbourhood outreach meetings in homes. The first

ones have been scheduled for every Thursday in Amos Waguchu's home.

The first two were held on Thursdays 20th and 27th .

In both meetings we had a total of 30 people attending. Most of the attendants were young people between 13 and 18 years.

22 of them committed their lives to Jesus Christ.

Let us lift these neighbourhood outreaches before the Lord.

These youths from Riruta have started a movement to reach out to all the youths in Riruta and

beyond. They have asked for guidance from BMF Leaders to accomplish this. Plans are underway to multiply the neighbourhood outreaches geared to reaching the youth and eventually, their parents.

They are planning to also set up sports outreaches, music concerts and retreats.

8. SATURDAY 29th ANNIVERSARY CONFERENCE

The Riruta youth planned to hold a Conference in my home (Samuel Njogu) that they incorporated with our 21 years marriage anniversary, and our son David's 14th birthday. Both anniversaries fall in April.

The youth supported the event by providing foodstuffs and other gifts to us. Those whose Birthdays in April were also celebrated on this occasion.

We spent the whole day with them from 11:00 am to 6 pm.

Over 30 youths were present including, the man who was delivered from demons in the previous Riruta Conference.

Seven members of the Riruta Chapter led by Amos Waguchu accompanied them.

We had a great time together to pray and thank God for Riruta, to plan for upcoming outreaches, and to teach the new believers. The youth also played some football in our compound.

We were very encouraged as a family through this visit.

We agreed that birthdays, anniversaries, sports events and retreats will be geared towards outreaches to the lost souls and Conferences to train and follow up new believers.

Join us in thanking God for His faithfulness to our family (Samuel and Lilian) as we celebrate 21

years of Marriage. Let us also lift David before the Lord as he celebrates 14 years of God's faithfulness in His life.

9. FRIDAY 28th to Sunday 30th - KIAMBU INSTITUTE OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY COLLEGE SCHOOL OUTREACH

Our team for High School and Colleges Outreaches were invited to Kiambu Institute of Science

and Technology (KIST) led by Vincent Njuguna, who is a student at KIST and a member of our

Chapter in Gikambura.

Vincent has reported that they conducted two outreaches, one for the students, and another in

an open area next to KIST College. They reached over 300 people in three days. They conducted

open-air outreach meetings where they shared their testimonies in the dormitories, college field and open areas around the school in the neighbouring communities. This was a bold step

that the team took.

In total, 170 people responded to receive the Lord. They were so encouraged by this outreach,

and there is a plan to invite me (Samuel Njogu) to KIST for another outreach where all students

will be invited to a meeting. I will also set up a Chapter there.

Let us pray for Vincent and the team at KIST for direction from the Lord and the infilling of the Holy Spirit so that they will boldly reach out to many areas and Colleges. Let us pray for the favour of the Lord, with the College administration as Vincent plans for my invitation there.

GARBAGE COLLECTORS

600 people have so far benefited from the garbage collection kits from the programme support finances. We thank God for this programme that is a blessing to so many homes. Let us pray that a proposal we have forwarded to Nairobi county for an empty space for the garbage collectors to use for sorting waste, will be made available. With such a space, the collectors will stand a chance to earn some more money through sorting the garbage they are collecting from various institutions.

Over 786 people have been reached with more than 364 men accepting to follow Jesus in April.

Report on Bmf-Uganda for April 2023.

On 28th April, Jude Musisi and I went to Kiburara Prison. We arrived there at at 1:30pm local time when the inmates were in the line receiving food for lunch. We waited 30minutes for them to finish, and then they gathered in the main hall to listen to the good news that we had brought for them.. The Officer on duty addressed them first and then invited Jude Musisi to take over. He gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his testimony, and then I gave my full testimony. 421 men received salvation out of the 503 men enrolled in that unit. 27 of them were Muslims. They told us at the end that they had renounced Islam after listening to us and believed in Jesus Christ as their Saviour, but they need to know more about Christianity because for Islam, they had their small Qurans which their relatives brought to them. They have been reading them on a daily basis and they know almost everything which is there, but unfortunately they don't see any hope of life in it. I gave them two Bibles (the 27 Muslims). I marked the chapters and verses in those Bibles which talk about salvation, resurrection and forgiveness of our sins, for them to read carefully and understand that Jesus is real and the true Saviour.

On 29th April, Tamale Moses, Kabugo Luke and Bizima Derick went to Makerere University Business School and spoke to 90 students, Moses gave a brief explanation

about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then Kabugo Luke gave his full testimony, and 40 students received salvation. They served chapatis and soda to the students at the end.

On 29th April, Jude Musisi and I went to Nyabushikya Prison. We arrived there at 8am, but it was raining non stop so we couldn't get out of the the car until midday when it stopped. The weather was so bad and the O.C asked us to wait for two more hours so that the inmates could first get lunch, and also the compound could dry up. They don't have a shelter where they can gather all the inmates at once, and so they had to make them sit on the grass which was still wet..At 2:30 pm they all gathered in the green compound. Jude Musisi gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his testimony, and then I gave my full story, Out of 326 men enrolled in that unit, 269 men repented and received salvation. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.

As we were going back to the trading centre, where we were supposed to stay for a night we found that the the rain had caused a small bridge to break in the valley which is near to the next town where we were heading to and the water had crossed the road. We thought it was the normal water flooding over the road due to heavy rainfall. When we tried to cross it, the car got stuck in the middle and we had to hire a tractor from the nearby district to pull it out,

On 30th April, Jude Musisi and I went to Kicheche Prison,.It continued to rain from morning up to midday, like the day before. We started the meeting at 2 pm with the attendance of 284 men, Jude Musisi gave a brief explanation about BMF, followed by his testimony, and then I gave my full story. 240 men received salvation, including the O.C. and three prison wardens, among whom were seven Muslims. We prayed for all of those with different problems. I believe God answered our prayers and set them free. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison.

On 31st April, we took the car to the garage to fix the damage caused by by the tractor while pulling it out from the trench and then drove back to Kampala.
